EDWARD M. STANHOUSE



Mr. Edward M. Stanhouse is Deputy Chief of the Simulators Division, Agile Combat Support Directorate, Aeronautical Systems Center, Air Force Materiel Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio. The Simulators Division directs 300 employees in research, acquisition and sustainment for more than 40 USAF and 10 foreign air force aircraft training systems. Mr. Stanhouse provides direction to multi-command, industry teams deploying the world's best training systems to the combat forces of today and tomorrow.

Mr. Stanhouse was commissioned in 1982 upon graduation from the United States Air Force Academy. While serving in the USAF, he gained experience in all phases of the acquisition process including research, development, test & evaluation, production and sustainment. He also worked in a broad range of programs including aircraft, missile and classified ground and space programs. Mr. Stanhouse has held leadership positions in national space programs, including directing a large multi-national engineering and operations team. He provided acquisition oversight and policy formulation for special operations forces and low intensity conflict capabilities under the Office of the Undersecretary of Defense (Policy), as well as performing program and budget oversight for Air Force mobility and training programs at Headquarters Air Force. Mr. Stanhouse was Commander, 516th Aeronautical Systems Group, serving as director of the C-17 acquisition and sustainment program. He was also Director, Requirements and Capabilities Integration Directorate, responsible for ensuring the Aeronautical Systems Center's enterprise capabilities were integrated to meet warfighter needs. He led capability-based planning by developing and executing initiatives, reusable tools, and processes across the Enterprise, as well as planning activities prior to initiation of acquisition programs, as user requirements were being defined. Mr. Stanhouse assumed his current responsibilities in October 2010.
