


Figure 1 A single-column figure

# WEB SITE REFERENCES

- 1. An IMAGE Paper is meant to be a permanent historical reference document. URLs/Hot Links are impermanent and therefore should be used rarely and then only in the REFERENCE SECTION.
- 2. All URLs/Hot Links must only appear in the REFERENCES SECTION at the end of the paper where they must be FULLY SPECIFIED & DOCUMENTED so that if the URL should expire a search can be launched to find the subject information. If a paper, document, or website cannot be associated with a specific author, date, and organization, it should not be cited since the responsibility for the validity of the information cannot be assigned.
- 3. URLs/Hot Links must be used only to document SPECIFIC TECHNICAL INFORMATION critical to understanding the paper. They must NOT refer to general web sites, company/organizational home pages, product descriptions, or to any sales & marketing web pages.

It is the responsibility of the Primary Author and SIG Paper Chair (with Paper Review Committee) to assure that all URLs/Hot Links in every paper are ACTIVE, and have been INSPECTED to ensure that the citation is complete as specified in Item #2 above.
